

'Nothing.'


'Nothing! Look at your hands. And look at your mouth. What is it?'



beat: (verb) to hit a person again and again

• She beats the boy with a stick.

bored: (adjective) feeling tired and unhappy because something is not interesting

We are bored in these lessons.

brush: (noun) an object made of hair to paint something

• He needs a brush to paint the walls.

decide: (verb) to choose something after thinking carefully

• She decides to be a teacher.

ferryboat: (noun) a small ship that carries people across water

fight: (noun) a physical action to hurt other people
